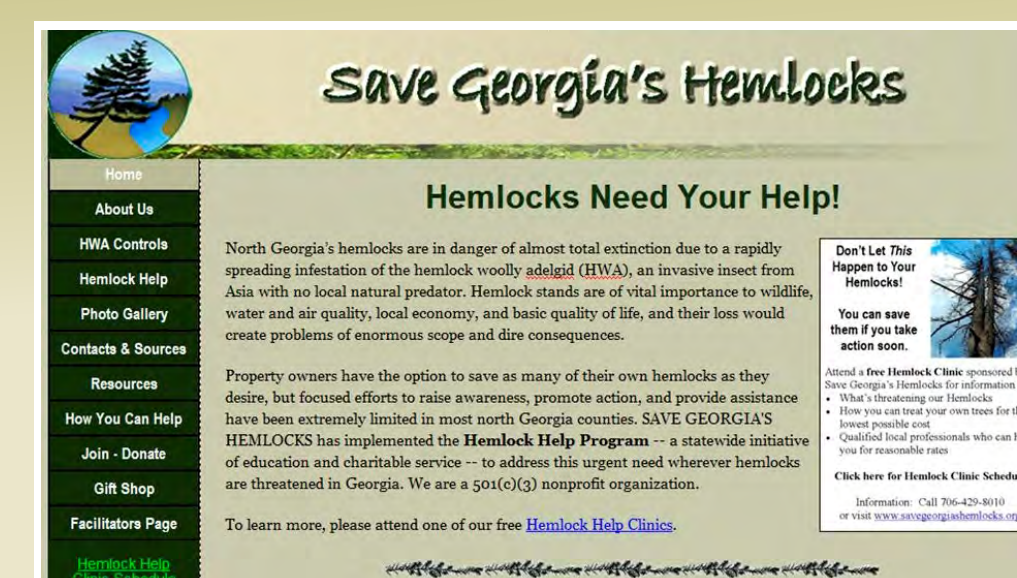
Participation in local fairs and festivals to raise awareness, provide useful printed information, and offer healthy hemlock saplings for adoption.
