8:30 a.m. – Hemlock Helpers will receive a briefing on the condition of the hemlocks, treatment process to be used, and safety reminders. You will be organized into small teams including one experienced SGH Facilitator or experienced adult per team, receive your equipment and supplies, be directed to your treatment site, and begin treating trees.

11:35 a.m. – Treatment teams should return to central mixing station to clean injectors and travel to Dining Hall for lunch.

1:00p.m. – Meet at central mixing station to begin treating again.

3:15 p.m. – Our target project completion time is 3:15 p.m. We will stop work and clean equipment. Those not involved with Ordeal Ceremonies or other activities will continue to treat to complete the treatment.

- **Terrain:** The terrain at the project site varies from moderately rolling to steep. We'll make sure everyone is assigned to a work site where they can be safe and comfortable.
- What to Wear: Dress for the weather and the activity, including long pants and long sleeves, sturdy footgear with socks, gloves, and rain gear in case of light rain. Nitrile gloves will be provided for those who will be handling chemicals.
- What to Bring: Personal water bottle and a camera if you like. Your favorite hiking stick and a small day pack to carry things in may come in handy. If you have any serious allergies (like bee stings), bring whatever you need to manage.
