	Noon – Lunch and fellowship, lunch-and-learn on fall fishing tactics.
WHAT TO WEAR:	Dress for the weather and the activity, including long pants and long sleeves, sturdy footgear with socks, work gloves, and rain gear in case of light rain.
WHAT TO BRING:	Several empty 1-gallon milk jugs, a bucket, and a shovel If you have any serious allergies (like bee stings), bring whatever you need to manage.
