## Indoors or outdoors

- Raising hemlock saplings in a nursery at your school or church

- Doing a hemlock-themed Eagle Scout project – lots of possibilities here!



## Outdoors

- Treating hemlocks at schools, parks, camps, or other public places
- Rescuing and potting hemlock saplings
- Planting hemlock saplings at your school, a park, or other public places
- Doing hemlock restoration on trout streams
- Helping in the SGH education station for a kids' event

## Usually indoors

- Distributing hemlock information in your school, church, or neighborhood
- Using your artistic talents to raise awareness
- Writing an article for your school newspaper
- Putting on the play "Once Upon a Hemlock"
