	DD: 34.73639 and -83.76500
Directions:	From Helen, GA: downtown Helen start going north on N. Main St./GA-75/GA -17 toward
	Hiawassee, GA.
	• Continue on GA-75/GA-17 due north to the intersection with Hwy 75 Alt.
	• Turn left (west) on to Hwy 75 Alt and drive approximately 100 yards to intersection with
	Chattahoochee River Road.
	Turn right on to Chattahoochee River Road which runs north. The intersection is between
	the Cool River Zip Line attraction and the Chattahoochee United Methodist Church.
	NOTE: "Road names" on various maps are confusing. The road may be labeled as
	Chattahoochee River Road, Forest Service road FS 44, Poplar Stump Road or Myra
	Branch Road. Stay on the paved/gravel road driving north approximately 2.0 miles. Do
	NOT turn off this road until you get to the SGH signage posted at the bridge to our
	treatment site.
	• The bridge will be marked with our SGH signage. Turn right. The treatment site is
	located on the other end of the bridge.
	Signs will be posted at the Hwy 17-75 intersection with Hwy 75 Alt as well as the intersection of
	Hwy 75 Alt and Chattahoochee River Road. There will also be a sign at the bridge leading to our
	treatment site. Parking is available along the road in several places.
Project:	According to prior treatment logs, we expect to treat about 120-150 trees last treated in 2008.
Schedule:	9:00 a.m. – SGH volunteer Team leaders report.
	9:15 a.m. – Hemlock Helpers meet to receive a briefing on the condition of the hemlocks, treatment
	process to be used, and safety reminders. You will be organized into small teams including one
	experienced SGH Facilitator per team, receive your equipment and supplies, be directed to your treatment
	site, and begin treating trees.
	12:00 p.m. – Treatment teams should assemble at our meeting site to clean their equipment and
	to come together for lunch.
	12:30 p.m After lunch we will caravan to our next treatment site.
	By 3:30 p.m. – Our target project completion time is 3:30 p.m.
Terrain:	The terrain in the Chattahoochee River Road HCA project areas varies from moderately rolling to steep
	with heavy undergrowth in others. We'll make sure everyone is assigned to a work site or job assignment
