	From Hiawassee, GA: Start by going south on Franks St toward N Main St/US-76 E/US-76 W/
	GA-75/GA-17/GA-2.
	• Take first left onto N Main St/US-76E/GA-75/GA-17/GA-2. Continue to follow US-76 E/

Terrain:	The terrain in the High Shoals HCA project areas varies from moderately rolling in one site to steep with
